- 3. 1) Great Britain had violated American sovereignty by refusing to surrender western ports as promised in the Treaty of Paris
 - 2) Great Britain began stopping American sea vessels and forcing subjects to those sea vessels to enter the British Navy
 - 3) Trade embargoes by Britain and France resulted in the seizing of American ships
 - 4) Great Britain controlled much of Canada, and many Americans simply wanted to expel the British from North American and expand America's borders

- 6. They were upset that westward bound American settlers were encroaching on their land
